For such a small island, there is so much to do during your holiday!

1. Visit the **Farmers Produce Market** Saturday from 7.30am & the **Island Markets** on Sundays from 8.30am, held in the Bi-Centennial Complex on Taylors Road.
2. Explore the Convict Ruins in the World Heritage listed area in Kingston.
3. Explore the 4 Norfolk Island Kingston museums.
4. One of these Museums is totally dedicated to artefact's of the HMS Sirius.
5. Visit the Bounty Folk Museum on the corner of Queen Elizabeth Ave & Middlegate Road
6. Drive to the top of Mount Pitt for a 360° view of the Island.
7. Walk to the Highest Point of the Island (Mt Bates).
8. Discover Cockpit Waterfall.
9. Take a look through Government House (limited to one Wed. per month)
10. Watch the cargo boat unload (limited visits throughout the year)
11. Explore the National Parks & enjoy the Walking Trails & Bird Life
12. Wander through the Botanic Gardens
13. Attend a N.I church service & experience the renowned "sing-a-long" to traditional Island hymns
14. Visit Fletcher's Mutiny Cyclorama 360° painting of the famous Bounty history.
15. Visit Sweeties the Chocolate & Lolly factory.
16. Visit the Liqueur Factory for "FREE" Liqueur Tasting
17. Swim at Emily Bay (listed in the top 10 beaches of the South Pacific)
18. Swim & Snorkel at Slaughter & Emily bays & marvel at the Marine Life.
19. Play Norfolk's 9 hole Seaside Golf course – in the World Heritage area of Kingston
20. Visit Captain Cook lookout & monument (take a picnic & stay)
21. Book a tour on the Glass Bottom Boat.
22. Take a guided Kayak tour around the rugged coastline & off Shore Rock Islets.
23. Experience Traditional Island Weaving & Hat making – Wed at the Golden Orb Café
24. Hire a Fishing Rod & go fishing off the Jetties.
25. Book an Island cliff top Fish Fry, enjoy the traditional Island food & entertainment
26. Experience the popular Progressive Dinner, where island families welcome you into their homes.
27. Book a Horse & Carriage ride on the beautiful Clydesdales – Culla & Co
28. Enjoy a Billy Tea or City Slicker horse ride – Silky Oaks Stables
29. Experience Anniversary (Bounty) Day Celebrations – (yearly, 8th June,)
30. Take a boat trip & guided trek to Phillip Island, one of Norfolk's outer Islands.
31. Take a Water Colour Painting Class with "The Local Gallery"
32. Walk the boardwalk down to Bumboras reserve and rock pool beach.
33. Mix & mingle at the Mini Bar open until late.
34. Visit the Liquor bond to purchase liquor at duty-free prices (Can be consumed on the Island) – Remember to show your airline ticket to receive a 30% discount
35. Hire a bike & cycle around the island.
36. Enjoy a fun night out at "Housie/Bingo"
37. Rejuvenate with a relaxing massage or beauty treatment.
38. Participate in a local Yoga class or Tai Chi.
39. Lose yourself in the Hedge Maze.
40. Experience a stunning Sunrise & Sunset.
41. Take the many steps to the top of flagstaff hill centenary walkway.
42. Have a game of fun free Mini Golf at the Toy Shop at the top of Grassy Road – open 2-5pm daily.
43. Explore the Toy Shops & purchase the worlds cheapest Lego.
44. Walk through 100 Acres reserve & see the magnificent Morton Bay Fig Trees
45. Join in on the local sports! Touch football, Tennis, Squash , Bowls, Archery
46. Book a fishing trip; we call it catching not fishing!

47. Experience real paddock to plate at many restaurants & cafes, taste local beef, fish & produce.
48. Visit the cottage pottery.
49. Take a history tour and learn about the 4 layers of Norfolk's background.
50. Stroll through the Islands cemetery – The most Unique historical cemetery in Australasia
51. Take a look at Norfolk's Old whaling station site at Cascade Bay
52. Visit "Wildwood" for local wood turning demonstrations & local Crafts – (Wed - Sat: 1-4pm)
53. Take a gentle stroll through Walk in the Wild, read the story boards & dioramas.
54. Take a Lantern Lit Ghost tour with Baunti Escapes 'it will give you chills'
55. Watch the Trial of the Fifteen at the Ferny Lane Theatre, and then meet the cast.
56. Visit the St Barnabas Chapel, marvel at the rose windows.
57. Stop for wine tasting at Two Chimney's Winery.
58. Feed the ducks and geese at watermill dam.
59. Learn to cook with Hilli's restaurant chef at the Mastering Taste Class & garden Tour.
60. Join the Bird Watching tour you may even see the rare green parrot.
61. Have your photo taken amongst the huge fig trees on Headstone Road.
62. Take a night walk and star gaze at the amazing sky line, the stars feel so close.
63. What about a midnight walk through the convict cemetery?
64. Explore the local bottle house – yes you guessed it a house made entirely of bottles.
65. Catch a movie at the "Ferny Lane" Theatre, get there early & reserve a couch.
66. Visit the "World of Norfolk" exhibit
67. Hop on the old Model T Ford car and discover the Pitcairn Settlers Village.
68. Wave to passing cars (and the cows too if you wish!) it's called the Norfolk wave.
69. Collect Hihis (periwinkles) from the rocks and try this local delicacy.
70. Take a stroll down the winding track to the bottom of Anson Bay.
71. Hug a Pinetree! (water is stored in their trunk, so this will cool you down)
72. Book a 4WD tour and get off the beaten track.
73. Listen to the local language with Archie at the magnificent Wonderland by Night.
74. Discover the fish and coral in our beaches & a walk along the reef with a guide.
75. Take a swim in the rain; just remember to leave your towel in the car.
76. Research your convict history at the KAVHA research centre.
77. For the music buffs Norfolk offers the Jazz festival & Country music festival.
78. Indulge in tasting the local cheese on the Christian Brothers Cheese Tour.
79. Plant a tree with the local land care group.
80. Feed Mr Bull at The Blue Bull Café in town. Blue Boy is in the paddock behind the cafe.
81. Visit Simon's Water private property open to the public – stroll to the cliff-top overlooking Cascade – Just remember to shut the gate.
82. Shop, Shop & Shop! We have a large variety of shops and many goods are sourced from around the world.
83. Stop at the local road side stalls for in season fruit and vegetables; drop your money in the honesty boxes.
84. Purchase a set of beautiful Norfolk Island postal stamps.
85. See a demonstration of local bone carving on the art trail tour.
86. Take a photo of yourself in the convict stocks outside Barney Duffy's.
87. Taste locally cooked goodies! Such as coconut bread and guava jelly on scones YUM
88. Spoil yourself and friends on a High Tea at a Cliff Top property.
